<u>Literacy</u>

This week our drawing club has been centred around the cartoon Wacky Races. We had great fun designing vehicles with special contraptions to catch other wacky racers out! We thought about what we might win if we came first in the race and considered what would happen if you came last. In phonics we spent the week recapping sounds and practising our blending skills. Next week we will be moving on to phase 3.

At home you could try:

- Making collections of 4 and 5 using a variety of materials
- Using the sounds from your sounds pack to create words e.g. neck, hut, bad, etc. Make sure you get your child to read the word once they have made it.
- Practising songs and lines from our nativity play
