Communication and Language

Stories and books we have enjoyed this week!



Literacy

This week we have been looking at the book 'Incredible You'. The children thought about an animal they would like to be and explained why. Later in the week they thought about what made them incredible. Ideas ranged from being able to swing on the monkey bars, write their name, look after pets, play football and being kind!

In our phonics this week we have continued to build on rhyme and alliteration. We have been playing games to help us break words into sounds and also putting sounds together to say words.

At home you could try:

- Using mathematical language to compare objects of different size, length or height and e.g. long and short, or tall and short
- Reading or singing nursery rhymes and identifying the rhyming words
- Practising doing up and undoing buttons and zips

Notes for Parents

Next week the children will be bringing home a reading book and a reading record book. They will also be provided with a reading wallet to keep them in. 
Please remember that family boxes are due in on **Monday 26th September** and they will remain in school until your child has had a chance to share it. This will take place over the rest of this half term.

In maths this week we have been looking at comparisons such as fewer and greater when comparing quantities, longer and shorter when comparing length, taller and shorter when comparing height. We used the Book Dear Zoo to look at size comparisons and finding the most suitable container for an object.
