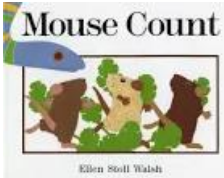
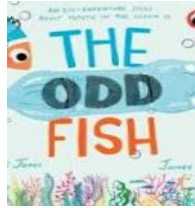

Literacy

Our story this week was 'Somebody Swallowed Stanley'. We drew the Stanley (the plastic bag) in one of the settings from the story. The children wrote about Stanley being swallowed by another sea creature and then finally they thought about what a bag could be used for e.g. a kite, superhero cape, parachute for a toy etc.

The children also thought of and wrote their own sentence about the ducklings.

At home you could try:

- Create a one more or one less book to 10 using pictorial representations

Expressive Arts and Design






