
Stories and books we have enjoyed this week!











## Literacy

This week we followed the Diwali story of Rama and Sita. We had great fun acting it out and roleplayed using masks. We drew our favourite character and talked about whether they were brave, kind, courageous, mean etc.

We also used shared writing to write a list of things you would need to celebrate Diwali and some children went on to make their own Diwali cards.

### At home you could try:

- Spotting shapes around your home or when you are out and about. Ask your child how they know it is a particular shape.

- Reading the words attached and spotting sounds when out and about.
- Continue to practice getting dressed, putting on coats and doing the zip up.

#### Maths

In maths we have been looking at circles and triangles. We know that circles have one curved side and triangles have three straight sides and three corners. We realised that triangles might look very different from each other. On Wellie Wednesday the children created their own 'nearly triangles' using natural materials.

#### Understanding the World

We have been talking about our similarities and differences between ourselves, how we look and the things we like. We thought that it was good that everyone has differences!

We have also been looking at Diwali, the festival of light and how people celebrate it.

#### Expressive Arts and Design

We moulded our own Diva lamps from clay and then decorated them with paint.

We have also enjoyed learning some Bollywood dance moves!

We used the powder paints to create our own paint. We also explored what colours we could make with red, blue, yellow and white. We looked at shape pictures by the artist Kandinsky and some children painted in his style.
