add, more, and make, sum, greater, total, altogether, score, double, one more, two more, how many more to make... ? how many more is... than...? What is the same? What is different?

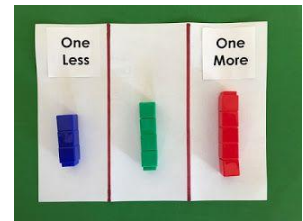
One to one correspondence

Matching an item or items to a corresponding number. This can be matching 3 buttons to the number 3, placing 4 softs toys by the number 4 or pegging the corresponding number onto the matching amounts of dots.



One more

Using an amount of objects between one and ten, ask the child to find one more. How many do we have now?



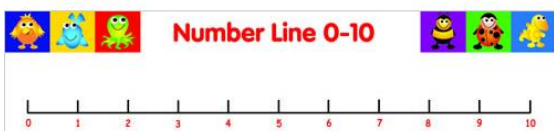
Using materials to add

Using two groups of small objects, ask the child to count the first group and then continue on counting the next group until they find the answer.



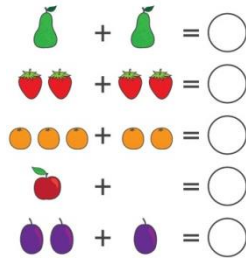
Counting on

Give a number between 1 to 10 and ask the child to count on using fingers, number lines, gems, cubes etc.



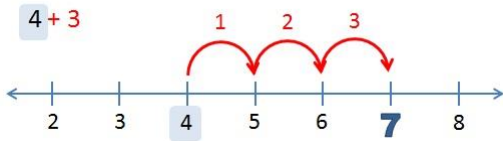
Using pictures

Use pictures of objects to encourage counting on.



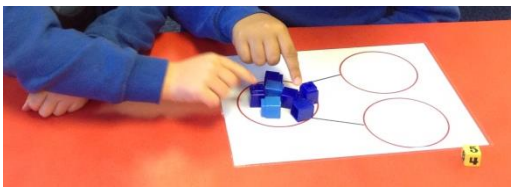
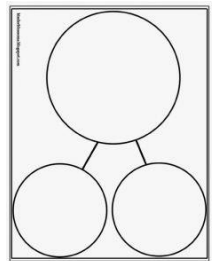
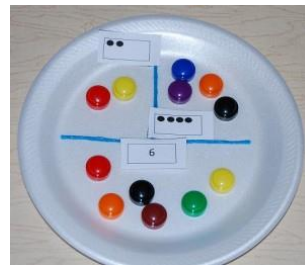
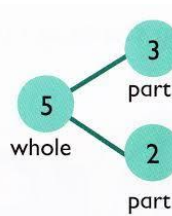
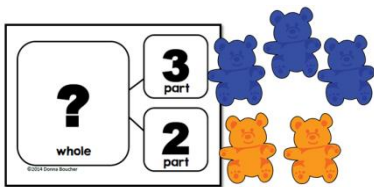
Using a number line

Start at a specific number between 1 and 10 and jump the amount being added to find the answer.



Part, part, whole

Use two sets of objects in the smaller circles and move the objects down into the large circle. How many are there altogether? Move on to using a number card instead of one set of objects and then onto number cards in each of the small circles.
